GRANT WAREHAM, a 17-year-old native of Dayton, Ohio, studies organ with Jerry Taylor, piano with Barbara Wasson, and violin with Maretta Alden. The Ohio Federation of Music Clubs named Grant the Outstanding Junior for 2013, and he was a winner of the first WDPR/Classical 88.1 Young Talent Search. Grant, a National Federation of Music Clubs award winning composer, has been awarded many music scholarships for piano, violin and organ over the past several years. Grant plays violin in the Dayton Philharmonic Youth Orchestra and the DPYO Quartet; he also serves as the Orchestra's music librarian. Grant is concertmaster of the Music Machine Orchestra, as

well as a member of the Kettering Church Choir and the Kettering Handbell Ensemble. He is a substitute organist for many churches in the Miami Valley, and was interim organist for six months at the Lutheran Church of Our Savior in Oakwood, Ohio. Grant and his family have an active music ministry for local nursing home and retirement center residents. As the City Slickers 4-H Club President, Grant has won numerous awards at the Ohio State and Montgomery County Fairs. A homeschooled senior, Grant will attend Shepherd School of Music at Rice University this fall majoring in organ performance.

about the instrument

American organ builders Elias and George Hook, brothers from Boston, constructed the 52-stop, 3,504-pipe instrument in 1864. It is the oldest unaltered four-keyboard pipe organ in the Western Hemisphere located at its installation site. Restored in 1982 and again in 2013, the Hook Organ is one of the most popular and respected organs in the United States. It has been featured numerous times on National Public Radio, performed in several recordings, and has been featured on television and in a major motion picture, as well as in a music video starring Michael Crawford, the original "Phantom of the Opera."
