

Founded in 1947, The Worcester Youth Orchestras (WYO) have offered musical training, orchestral experiences and fostered life long friendships for aspiring young musicians in Central Massachusetts for nearly 70 years.



The orchestra's membership draws from over 60 towns and 72 schools in Massachusetts, Connecticut and Rhode Island, representing the finest talent from public, private and community music school programs. WYO is the third oldest youth orchestra in the country and has a long history of masterful performances at Mechanics Hall, The AUD, The DCU, Tuckerman Hall, Alden Hall, Hanover Theatre as well as some of finest concert halls throughout the country. Under the direction of Jonathan Brennand, WYO has grown from one orchestra to four orchestras, a jazz program, wind ensemble, clarinet & flute choir and honors chamber music program over the past 5 years. The program serves more than 200 students and draws an annual audience of more than 5,000 each season. WYO is committed to community outreach and partnerships and presents over 25

concerts each year in a variety of venues and locations in Greater Worcester, thus enriching the cultural life of the area.

Worcester Youth Jazz Combo will perform a wide range of repertoire. An understanding of the jazz tradition and the Great American Songbook will coincide with contemporary interpretation. The ensemble will focus on improvisation, group arranging, non-verbal cues, world music influences, and contextual improvisation.

Hailed by the Boston Globe as "the real deal, [a bandleader] that looks and sounds like the 1940s." Dan Gabel is a trom-

bonist, arranger, bandleader, historian, and educator. Mr Gabel has toured internationally with the Glenn Miller Orchestra, as well as the Tommy Dorsey, Cab Calloway, and Hal McIntyre Orchestras. He recently has been featured at the 2016 Montreal Jazz Festival, the Newport Mansions "Art Deco Festival" and in several musicals. Considered an expert on jazz, big bands, and the Great American Songbook, Gabel has lectured at colleges, universities, and special events across the country including Harvard, MIT, and Indiana University. In addition to playing with groups all over New England, Dan Gabel is the Music Department Director at his alma mater, Holy Name High School in Worcester Massachusetts. In 2016 he began the jazz program with Worcester Youth Orchestras.

Born and raised in Middlesex, England, Jonathan Brennand's conducting has been praised by the Cape Cod Times for its "precision and vitality". He is in his 5th season with the Worcester Youth Orchestras serving as Artistic and Executive Director. He conducts the WY Symphony Orchestra & Baroque Orchestra and oversees the entire WYO program and ensembles working with more than 15 faculty members and staff. He enters his 13th season with College Light Opera Company this summer, serving as Principal Conductor and Music Director. In addition he is Music Director & Conductor of the Farmington Valley Symphony Orchestra (CT) and conducts a 5-concert subscription series each season. Jonathan maintains an active quest conducting schedule throughout the Northeast and regularly appears at NYSSMA, MMEA, and CMEA.



He has appeared in concert at Mechanics Hall, as well as guest artist with the Boston Pops, and on concert tour in Europe and the U.S. For thirty years, he was a Sr. Engineering Manager at Intel (formerly Digital (DEC)). Since corporate retirement, he is CTO & Owner of Sherwood Hosting, providing web hosting, database, web, & graphic design (including this program), and commercial photography.

Worcester Organ Concerts are presented by Mechanics Hall and the Worcester Chapter of the American Guild of Organists to showcase the magnificent 1864 Hook Organ - also known as The Worcester Organ - and talented organists and musical artists from New England and beyond. Programming includes organ performance, silent films and multimedia performances.

American organ builders Elias and George Hook constructed the 52-stop, 3,504-pipe instrument in 1864. It is the oldest unaltered four-keyboard pipe organ in the Western Hemisphere located at its installation site. Restored in 1982 and refurbished in 2013, the Hook Organ has become one of the most popular and respected organs in the United States.
